If you were at the Easter Mass on Sunday Morning, you may recognize that these ideas were central to my homily. I had decided to review some of the phrases we've used over the years. I realized as I prepared for Easter that each of these phrases, within themselves capture the Easter message. Jesus came because he LOVES us (so stay CALM) and is always so GOOD. Easter reminds us that "You Matter" and that no matter what, Jesus gave His life for EACH of us. And that Jesus is the All Star, Most Valuable player but Jesus accepts us because Jesus is Good and We Matter, and are Loved. Love Wins when Jesus is in our lives and our game. We are so blessed.

Interesting point about Mark's Gospel is that it has two endings. This is the first one. "So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid." (Mark 15), Then in Mark 16 is the account of the women headed to the tomb and being told by the angel that Jesus is not there anymore. This is the second ending that Scripture scholars agree was added later to Mark's Gospel.

However, here in the first ending lies our third challenge of these 50 days: the challenge of overcoming our fear – our terror and amazement – and sharing the Good News – the Gospel with others. We are called to live out as witnesses the incredible love Jesus Christ has for each of us in our own time and place. And Jesus not only has our back, but we have each other.

This means serving one another – and not just the ones who are easy to love. This means also loving the stranger we do not know. This means going to the Cross and forgiving those who have persecuted us. Every day we must celebrate the Light of the World once again breaking into the darkness, the resurrection continues – through us. Let your light shine.
