

Padre's Portion... I would like to talk Synod for a minute. A Synod as called by Pope Francis means the Church is "journeying together" and we were to look at what is happening in our local Church. Remember, some of you took part in the round table discussion we had in preparing the document to be submitted with all the other parishes. You can find the Archdiocesan link in the bulletin where you can go to read the summary.

However, I'd like us to continue the dialogue among ourselves. What areas do we want to address, review, and improve in our parish? The Archdiocesan summary offers some suggestions entitled: "Wounds that need attention and healing." Now we may not be able to impact the greater Church, but we can start right here with our community. So what ones of these areas would you like to discuss?

I'd like to have a round table discussion once a month beginning in October. We'd meet on a Wednesday after Mass and that evening at 6:30. This would be about an hour discussion. We could pick the topic out of this list ahead of time. So that's your first assignment. What would be the top four you'd like to talk about more? Send them to me or let me know at Church. I want these discussions to be of interest and value to us as a Parish.

I've been wonderfully busy celebrating weddings this last month, and if you've been at one of them, I stress the idea that a marriage is a "covenant" between two people and God. It's unbreakable and forever. And God made those with Noah, Abraham, Moses, all the prophets and on and on. All of these covenants had signs: rainbow, a couple of stone tablets, multiple stars in the sky. But at a wedding our sign is the humble act of Jesus Christ who gives his body and blood to us every time we gather at this table. A wedding is a crucial event especially when set within the context of Communion because we enter into this meal like the Last Supper and Jesus seals the deal with us. And every time the married couple comes to the table God renews his covenant with us -- an unbreakable bond given to us through, in and with Jesus Christ.

A wedding is fun but is also serious. I joke, "I'm tying the knot tight," but really, no joke. I pray regularly for all the couples I've witnessed their vows.
