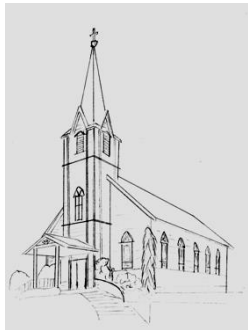

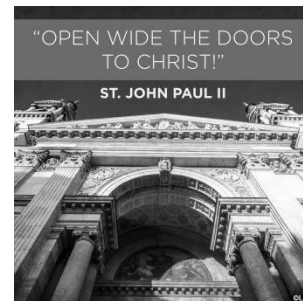

Padre's Portion... "If we are worth anything, it is not because we have more money or more talent, or more human qualities. Insofar as we are worth anything, it is because we are grafted into Christ's life, his cross and resurrection. That is a person's measure." -- St. Oscar Romero

Two major events have occurred and are occurring in Rome these past two weeks. Last Sunday, Pope Francis canonized seven new saints for us. Five of them I didn't know about, but two I did; Oscar Romero and Pope Paul VI. Pope Paul was elected when I was still in grade school and he guided through the Church with the changes of Vatican II. Looking back now, a huge undertaking for this quiet, introverted, brilliant Pope guide the Church for 15 years helping the Church tap back in to its roots and becoming more ecumenical and pastoral. I didn't appreciate him till I started reading the joys and struggles of his papacy. Look him up on line.

However, the one I was most excited about was St. Oscar Romero. If you don't know his story, I encourage you to learn about this martyr of El Salvador. Yes, there's a movie but it steps out of the truth to enhance his story, but when you read what he did to bring an awareness of the plight of the poor and homeless to his people, he garnered the respect and love of his people but also the ire of the revolutionary government. The oppressive government came to be so afraid of Romero and his love of his people that he was assassinated while celebrating Mass. Please look up the homily he was giving when he was brutally killed. This all occurred in the early 1980's and now finally deserves (thanks to Pope Francis) the title of Saint. Romero stands as a witness who lived out Francis' call to take care of the poor.

The other event is a month long synod of the Bishops. What's a synod? It's an assembly of church bishops (and delegates) to focus and discuss issues of the Church. What interests me so much is the focus of this meeting, it is a month long synod of Youth. Youth from all over the world are invited and many are speaking at different times during the day. The youth are bringing up all topics: the dark side of the abuse that has happened; the need to have a stronger voice in the Church; the need for the Church to support them where they are at today; the important role of social media, the way to reach them, drug abuse, sex trafficking, injustice towards migrants-- and it's only been a week. You can read a session summary each day on "Vatican News". Pope Francis is behind this; attends part of the session each day, greets all the participants at the door each morning.

Then the big event for our Parish this weekend is Confirmation of six of our teenagers: Iyke Igwe, Olivia Jackson, Nick Sawtelle, Bella Sigari, Clayton Stacey and Noah West. Please pray for them. Confirmation is the sacrament where we ask them to know that the power of the Spirit will bring them through any of life's journeys. Please pray for them. What do you remember about your Confirmation?

Paul Allen died Monday, October 15 at age 65. Founded Microsoft (which affects pretty much every person on the earth,) with Bill Gates, and was about the 40th wealthiest person on the planet. Owner of the Portland Trailblazers (go Blazers) and Seattle Seahawks. A good and generous man and yet he is not with us anymore. It is times like this that we need something much bigger than we might have been leaning on. Also, we realize the playing field is leveled. We remember that no one is better or separate from anyone else. We are all equal and we all belong to each other. This is the world God dreams of. Your dreams?
