

Padre's Portion... The Church is called the Body of Christ. Today's feast focuses on how the Body of Christ is nourished and in turn gives life. From the Old Testament, from the early Christian community and from the Gospel we hear accounts of blessings associated with the giving of life. They dying and rising of Jesus, the freedom from enemies and the abundance of nourishment give and sustain life.

Thus a special weekend is set aside to celebrate the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ or some of us remember it as "Corpus Christi." This weekend is another opportunity for us to reflect and realize the incredible gift we have been given in the Eucharist. Regardless of our sin and shame, our grace and guilt all of us are invited to this table to share of the meal Jesus shared with His disciples at the Last Supper. The words cannot be dulled by repetition or ruined by routine but filled with an awe that the Son of God makes it possible still today to feed us. His sacrifice out of love for us still stands today. I remember one young man who entered the Church a few years ago said to us, "The gift of His body and blood is greater than anyone can ask for."

The Church becomes the Body of Christ precisely when it acts in the way of Jesus – by being present to the hungry and the broken. Did you know 35,000 children worldwide die a day from starvation! Sometimes is on such a grand scale that it becomes news. More often, and perhaps more importantly, are the times when bringing the presence of Jesus into our world is such an ordinary part of the fabric of our lives that we only recognize it when we stop and reflect. For example, sitting with a sick person, feeding a child, preparing a family dinner, and sharing a meal with a stranger are all life-giving acts. These are opportunities to thank God for the gift of life.

As you are aware, every year I take a week in the summer for retreat. The tough part for this year, is my retreat Master passed away last December. He's been coming to Oregon or I have been going to D.C. for nearly 20 years, or last year when he couldn't travel due to frailty, we did phone conversations. So Fr. John and I were on our own this year. However, a couple of great reflections came around a couple of activities. We read a book by Jean Vanier We Need Each Other: Responding to God's Call to Live Together. Jean died a few weeks ago at 90 years old leaving behind a number of books, but a life that challenged all who knew him to respond in love to God's call. Lots of food for thought. This could be one of our Advent books. Then we watched Season 2 of "The Kindness Diaries." It is on Netflix. We watched Season last summer while on retreat, and so thoroughly enjoyed Season 2 even more. Watch both seasons!! Great for the whole family. A couple of the episodes this Season brought tears to my eyes. Enriching, challenging, and brings you to reflect on how kindness is manifested in one's life. I am so blessed (and mandated by the priesthood promises to take this week each year.)

And thank you to all of you who helped support Daphnie and Clayton Stacey in their efforts to attend the Scouts of America base camp in July. So many of you made incredible "goodies" for them to sell, and then everyone seemed to purchase something or just flat out donate to this adventure for their young lives. Truly you are the Body of Christ to them in very practical ways.

I'm sure all of you have marked on your calendar our first -- but I'm sure not the last -- Parish Spaghetti Dinner -- on Friday, June 28th, the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. So many volunteers have been working behind the scenes to make this event really memorable as we bless and dedicate our new Fellowship Hall and "Christen" it for all the forthcoming adventures we will share together. The plan is to serve dinner between 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. We will pause about 6:00 p.m. for the blessing and dedication. Please plan on joining us.

Again, I'm in awe of the beautiful building YOU have built. Thank you from the bottom of my heart for all you support in so many different ways.
