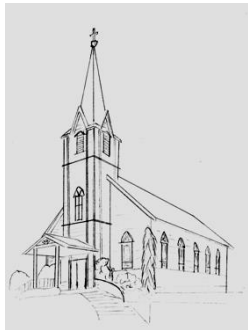

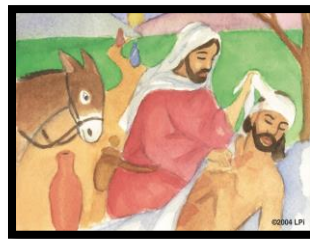

## **July 14<sup>th</sup>, 2019**

**Padre's Portion...**In this weekend's Gospel, the lawyer addressing Jesus knew with certainty the letter of the law, but did he understand the spirit of the law? The spirit of the law calls for a person's total engagement, heart, soul, strength and mind, in responding to the commandment to love God, neighbor and self. To illustrate this and to answer the lawyer's inquiry as to who was his neighbor, Jesus tells the parable of the Good Samaritan. It was a Samaritan, one looked down upon by Jews as unclean, who chose to help the beaten man. Without a doubt the Samaritan showed the greatest awareness of what it means to live the commandment of love. At the end of the parable Jesus charged the lawyer to go and do the same.

The knowledge and ability to live out God's command to love was not foreign to the Israelites. In the first reading, Moses called on the Israelites to adhere to the commandments with all their heart and soul. This knowledge of God's command is already in our mouths and hearts, and all we are to do is to live it out in our lives. Easier said than done, but we do not give up. We have the grace and mercy of God sustaining us.

In Paul's letter to the Colossians, the perfection of this love is realized in and through Jesus Christ. It is in Christ Jesus that the fullness of what it means to live a selfless love is best exemplified. Through this selfless love, God reconciled everything on earth and in the heavens bringing peace to all.

Here's a prayer that I came across and have begun saying it this summer:

Lord, give us eyes to see the pain in other people's eyes, especially in the members of my own family.

Lord, give us ears to hear the cry of other people's voices, especially those of our own flesh and blood.

Lord, give us compassion to become involved in other people's needs, especially the needs of our own loved ones.

Lord, give us the humility never to walk on by because we fear rejection. Rather, give us the courage to reach out and ask, "Can I help?"

How about let those three words, "Can I help?" be our guide these summer months?

Question: Whom do you identify with in the story: the beaten one, the Levite, the priest, the Samaritan or the lawyer? How do you hear the Lord speaking to you through this Gospel?
