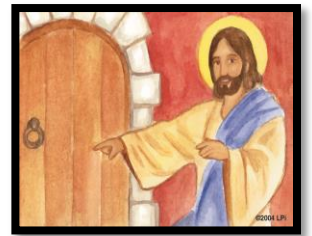

Padre's Portion... A great, daily check in is to place your actions against your definition of love. Jesus defined it pretty clearly in the story of the Good Samaritan. Have my words, thoughts and actions of this day reflected the "love" I want to live by? For example, when I encountered someone that I struggle with, was I gracious in my words? Did I not allow my thoughts to grip my heart and think hostile thoughts? Did I, if possible, extend a hand or even a hug in welcome? Reflect in terms of family. We all "love" our family members. Have our words, thoughts and actions truly reflected that "love" we say we have? It's tough to examine every day for me if I am truly living out Jesus' call to "love my neighbor as myself." Am I walking my talk? Of course, a family discussing this together would build great communication. Difficult but good.

In this weekend's 1st reading the story of Abraham's negotiations with God over the fate of Sodom and Gomorrah. It's an important reminder to us of just how freely we are invited to address God. From Abraham to Jacob to Moses to Jesus, we meet models for robust encounters with our God, and they do not hesitate to bargain, wrestle, argue and intercede with loud cries and tears for what they want and need for themselves and those we love. Abraham in this story bids down God's destructive intent regarding the two sinful towns to a fraction of the original threat. This remarkable story sets the tone for subsequent encounters between God and God's people.

Then in the Gospel, the disciples see this special intimacy Jesus enjoys in prayer and they ask him to teach them how to pray. Don't miss this! Jesus invites them into his own relationship with his "Abba", and instructs them to call God their "Abba." Their "Daddy". This intimate identity, anything they ask of God will be given to them, as long as they treat others as God is treating them, which includes forgiveness. Jesus adds to his instruction on prayer and a short parable about persistence. When we persist in prayer, our prayers deepen and our relationship with God deepens by being tested. When we pray, we never forget that our friendship with God, places God on our side. Any prayer inspired by love and justice will be answered, we believe, but not without our own engagement with God's will over time and not without courage to see it through no matter what.

I so enjoy at the end of Sunday's Mass to invite people to "Coffee and Donuts" in our new Fellowship Hall. What a great feeling inside my heart. Come over and enjoy a little extra time. The Fellowship Hall is such a beautiful building to rest and relax with each other. Take advantage of this gift.
