Tylenol is keeping the pain under control for me. It is a slow go. Now my upper arms have been really hurting from arthritis for quite a while. In fact, I'm on a cortisone schedule of shots every 4 months. They have become quite painful again if I move them in the wrong direction. So many of you help me get my jacket off and on as well as my alb for Mass. I'm humbled. My energy level is less than it used to be, but I'm not giving up. It may take me longer to get from my car to the Church, but I'll get there, I may save steps by not processing in or out, but I will be able to lead you in prayer. I love celebrating Mass and will NOT give the Mass up. We have great Councils who advise me. We have great women in the Office who keep things going smoothly. They also know I'm available right after Mass. I often take appointments after Mass. I'll meet in the Church or the Fellowship Hall. I've had to make some shifts in my schedule; I hope it hasn't impacted you. If it has, please let me know. I will make myself available if you need some time with me. And, of course, most of my quiet time is spent praying for all of you who have blessed me so bountifully. Thank you from the depth of my heart and soul. You're loved.
