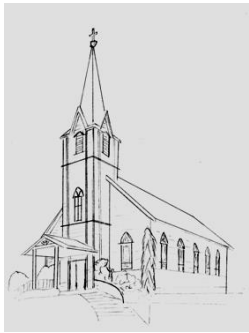

## **January 14<sup>th</sup>, 2024**

**Padre's Portion.....** We're back in the green! No, not for St. Patrick's Day, but we have entered Ordinary Time while we wait for Ash Wednesday and Lent on February 14th. During these 5 weeks the Church is "dressed in green," to remind us this is the time we are to "grow" in the incredible mystical events of the Advent and Christmas Seasons. What has been your favorite part of these past 7 weeks? What touches you the most about these 2 Seasons? The waiting? The patience? The glory of the universe? Do the Masses speak to you in a special way? Which of the Scripture readings nudge your heart? Of the entire Christmas story, which character is most like you? Please take some time and think about these weeks. They came upon us quick, and they will again.

Now let me share something I do to help keep the Seasons alive. I choose a Christmas hymn, one that I know at least the refrain to, and this remains part of my prayer time. Or I may even sing or hum a few bars during the day. For example, "Silent Night" is so beautiful and the words, "Wrapped in heavenly peace" not only helps me envision the newborn baby, but when I'm having a chaotic day, those words ringing in my mind calm me. How about "O Come, All Ye Faithful." This is more a march to me, and I love to repeat the line, "O Come, let us Adore Him". That is a clear reminder that is what I need to be doing this very day. All my words and actions need to adore the Lord. You got the idea. One more: "Joy to the World". What a great prayer. Please, Lord, bring joy to those who are ignored by me and others. Help me be an instrument of joy. There you have it. Choose one. Make it a mantra for you these next 6 weeks.

#### **#7: Take and Drink**

Catholics believe that we encounter God above all in sacramental signs. In Holy Communion, we share in God's own life through the sacrament of Jesus' own Body and Blood. Even though we receive the "whole Christ" – body, blood, soul, and divinity – when we receive Communion under the form of bread alone, receiving Communion also from the chalice is a more complete participation in the Eucharist. In the sign of consecrated wine, we see Jesus' blood outpoured for us and are challenged to drink from the common cup with our brothers and sister in Christ.
