## **October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2024**

**Padre's Portion....** Now this weekend's Gospel at first doesn't seem as challenging as past weeks but when we break down the symbolism Jesus is using, it is very challenging. Jesus asks James and John if they can drink that cup that He drinks. He also asks them, "Can you be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" Of course, typical male, they say they can. Now, these are great reflection points for us to sit and ponder as we enter into the Thanksgiving Season. Are we living out our baptism--submerged deeply in the experience of the love of Jesus Christ? Are we submerged in the pain/hatred/death that Jesus experienced? More than likely, we try to run away from these. Looking critically at our baptism is essential for our growth as Christians. Do we have a solid vision of our Christian journey? Has our vision to a Christian way of life continued to expand and grow over the years? Has our compassion grown over our years? Have we stayed connected with our own vulnerability? Are we more Joyful of belonging with those I live with, celebrate with, and love?

It is always so amazing to me about how deep we can go in the Scriptures. This passage recounts a humorous encounter in The Chosen. But in all seriousness of the symbol of the cup, when we drink from the cup at Communion, we need to ponder more what we are drinking. The Blood of Jesus shed for our salvation. And this has been celebrated and offered for 2000+ years. And will be for 2000+ more at least. And we're part of Jesus' offer to us to share. This Thanksgiving, we need and should give thanks to be invited to His Table.
