FROM THE PASTOR

("Easter Sunday, April 5, 2026, from the Gospel of Luke 24: 1-12"
continued from previous Parish Bulletin published on April 5, 2026)

...Compare and contrast Zachariah's response to the woman's response and the disciples' responses. The women are terrified and bowed to the ground. Then the two men in dazzling clothes say to them, "Why do you seek the living one among the dead? He is not here, but he has been raised." This is unheard of; this is unexpected. This is unimaginable if someone has died; he does not come back to life. The angels announced to the women something unheard of, something wonderful, something astonishing has happened: he is not here, he has been raised. This is the good news: God has done something great and marvelous beyond our understanding. He has raised Jesus from the dead, and now the new creation starts in the risen Christ.

Compare the disciple's response to Zechariah's response of unbelief. When the women come to speak to the disciples about the empty tomb, their story seems like nonsense, and they do not believe them. Their good news as met with doubt and unbelief.

Something unheard of, something wonderful, something astonishing occurred: he is not here; he has been raised. God the Father has raised up his son Jesus from the dead. Jesus died a horrible death on a cross, but God has raised him up on the third day. The victory over sin and death has been won. Now we share in this victory of Christ. We too should be filled with awe and wonder and surprising news he is not here, he is risen. That is good news for us who have given up hope at times. We can always have hope because of the good news: he is not here; he has been raised. We believe the words of the Angel, and we apply it to our lives.

The Eucharist unites us to the risen Lord. We meet him in this sacrament at the altar. God the Father has done something wonderful, something astonishing, something unheard of: He has raised his Son Jesus Christ from the dead and has begun the new creation. When we celebrate the holy Eucharist and receive Christ's body and blood, we encounter the risen Lord Jesus. Our response to this marvelous work of God the Father is to give him thanks and praise. Easter season lasts until Pentecost Sunday. During this time, I will be writing and teaching about Jesus the risen Lord present in the holy Eucharist.
